What a month April has been in both Swansea East and Westminster. Two of my campaigns collide, as the month began with the launch of the pre-payment certificate for HRT on April 1st and closed with the publication of the long-awaited Gambling White Paper. I and colleagues have campaigned so hard on both of these issues, so to have them bear fruit in the same month was so special. You know what they say about buses, you wait ages for one and then two come along at once!

Menopause Mandate in Westminster

April has been yet another big month in my campaign to improve support and awareness of the menopause. On what was meant to be a day of celebration, the launch of the pre-payment certificate for HRT on April 1st was marred by the Government's website for women to access cheaper treatment not working. Women across England had set their alarms, eagerly awaiting a solution that could see them save up to £270 a year on HRT, only to be left confused and anxious as the poorly advertised site was down the whole morning. Campaigners, educators and activists on women's health who have fought so hard to make this a mainstream topic and ensure our daughters and sisters do not have to suffer in silence, felt robbed of a moment to celebrate progress being made for women by the Government's oversight.

We then wrapped up the month by celebrating the 1-year anniversary of Menopause Mandate. This collective of advocates, specialists, educators and experts, spearheaded by Mariella Frostrup and Davina McCall came to Parliament to raise awareness amongst my colleagues. Political veterans like Iain Duncan Smith MP and Nick Smith MP came down to learn more about the menopause and how it may impact their constituents. The Westminster bubble loves it when the Menopause Mandate ladies roll into Parliament, not because they get to snack on cupcakes and get their photos taken with Lisa Snowdon, but because it means someone else is telling them they should be doing more to raise awareness of menopause and not me!

Publication of the Gambling White Paper

It may have taken eight years of campaigning, nine Culture Secretaries and ten changes in hair colour, but the Government have finally published the long-awaited Gambling White Paper. The White Paper sees the Government commit to reducing gambling related harm by updating our legislation, laws which haven't been changed since 2005. The White Paper includes a statutory gambling
