## The Menopause Mission in Westminster

March was a monumental month for my campaign to get better support, treatment and awareness of the menopause. It has also been a frustrating month that has seen two run ins with Ministers not doing their jobs!

The first clash came at the start of the month as Kemi Badenoch MP, the Minister for Women and Equalities, attended the Women and Equalities Select committee to discuss the committee's report into menopause and the workplace. The Minister showed her true colours and utter disdain at the idea of greater support for those women who may suffer terrible symptoms at work.

At the suggestion of the menopause being made a protected characteristic enshrined in law, the Minister suggested that such a request was no different from "short people" or "people with ginger hair" asking for similar treatment. When then asked why the Government had rejected the committee's recommendation of trialling menopause leave, the Minister suggested that there were "philosophical" differences, that I was "speaking from a left-wing perspective" and that the approach the committee was taking "is not one a centre-right Government would take". For obvious reasons, the Minister's offensive remarks caused outrage and videos online were seen millions of times, with thousands of women across the country aghast that this is the Minister responsible for 'Women and Equalities' !

The other own goal made by a Tory Minister responsible for oversight of the treatment of menopausal women was made only a few days ago. Maria Caulfield MP, Secretary of State for Women's Health Strategy, refused to attend the Women and Equalities Select Committee on Wednesday the 22<sup>nd</sup>, a significant breach of her responsibilities. This meant there was a chair to fill and the ladies from Menopause Mandate had to step up. Carol Vorderman, Mariella Frostrup, Kate Muir and Karen Arthur are experts on the menopause and prolific campaigners. They took the Minister and Government to task for the lip service they were paying to women's health and the 16 million menopausal women across the country.

I hope the Government were listening. When Carol Vorderman says your time is up, it is. She knows her way around a clock!
